Carol also spoke about the work of the Project Group. The major work was the completion and printing of a fully revised book of Tadley Walks - Tadley Tracks, Tadley Facts. The Project Group are now resuming work on the search for 'Missing Tadley', the medieval village, which is believed to have been in the area around old Tadley Church (St Peter's). Any help will be welcome. The Project meetings are usually on a Saturday morning.

Carol paid thanks to Peggy Anscombe who has left the Project Group after many, many years of hard work.

The accounts were accepted and the subscriptions were unchanged. The Society's funds had been considerably reduced by the printing of the book but since the end of the financial year the break even point has been passed and the funds are being replenished. Thanks go to Peter Gomm for his independent checking of the accounts.

The society's Constitution was briefly reviewed and deemed to be satisfactory.

**TADS President's Project** - The Farnborough Air sciences Trust are fund raising to erect a memorial to S F Cody (See December's Newsletter). It is proposed that the Society purchases some inscribed bricks to go in the surrounds of the memorial. The inscription will commemorate William Henry Brereton Evans who was Cody's passenger on his final flight at Farnborough on 7th August 1913, when both were killed. Evans had family connections with Tadley and was at the time staying with his sister at Fairlawn House, Tadley while on leave from the Sudan Civil Service. He was buried at St Peter's Church.
